Psychology Class Expectations and Procedures

Course Overview

The course is an introduction to the science of psychology and the findings that have come from psychological research, with an emphasis on how these may be applied to human life. Students examine the full scope of the science of psychology such as the historical framework, methodologies, human development, motivation, emotion, sensation, perception, personality development, cognition, learning, intelligence, biological foundations, mental health, and social psychology.

FOLLOW STUDENT/PARENT HANDBOOK RULES

COME TO CLASS PREPARED

- Homework is due at the beginning of class. This means when you enter the classroom your assignment is ready to turn in to me. In other words, no last minute finishing up on an assignment that is due that day. Any work turned in after class has started will be considered late and the late work policy will apply.
- Late work policy: A 30% deduction will be made from the grade earned. Late assignments will be accepted within 5 schools days, not to exceed the end of the 9-week grading period. See the current district policy located in your parent-student handbook.
- Proper heading is required on all handed in work.

BE IN YOUR SEAT WHEN CLASS BEGINS

- Class begins when the bell rings.
- Do not sit on or rest your feet on the desktops.
- All backpacks and purses will be stored under your desk or along the wall.

MAKE UP WORK/EXTRA CREDIT

- It is your responsibility to ask for and turn in all make up work. Check with me to see what you missed and what needs to be handed in to me. You get two days for each day you were absent to turn in work. All makeup work is due at the beginning of class. If you do not complete the work in the time allotted, the late work policy will apply.
- Missed tests/quizzes must be completed on your time. See me to schedule.
- Extra credit is for students who have completed all assigned class work. If you have missing assignments, don't ask.

GRADES/TUTORING

- Grading is calculated on a 100 point scale. Students are graded on a variety of assignments, including projects, quizzes, reading assignments, and other work. Each is worth the following percentage of the grade:
 - Summative (Tests/Projects/Research/Extended Labs/Unit Common Assessments/Major Writing Assignments): 50%
 - Formative (Daily/Labs/Quizzes/Homework/Reading Logs/Minor Writing Assignments/District Benchmark): 50%
- A comprehensive exam given at the end of the semester counts for 20% towards the final grade.
- Re-teach/Re-test is available for students who score below a 70 on a test. There is a deadline of one week after the original test date to set up a tutoring session outside of class.
- Tutoring is available on an appointment basis. Please schedule a date and time with me in advance. Please keep your appointment time and be sure you have made transportation arrangements.
- You will have unannounced pop-quizzes.
